Qualifications: Applicants must have a thorough range of technical watercolor skills as well as the ability to teach these skills to adults. Candidates must have a BFA or MFA, a minimum of two years teaching experience, strong foundation in art history, and a passion for teaching.

Teachers will be responsible for designing their own curriculum.
